I am contacting you today to express the Idaho Farm Bureau Federation's (IFBF) strong support for the proposed Sandpoint Junction Connector Project. IFBF is Idaho's largest agriculture organization, representing over 78,300 member families throughout Idaho. Of these families, approximately 60% are farmers and ranchers.

With the exception of the Port of Lewiston, Idaho is a landlocked state. Idaho exports agricultural products throughout the United States and the world. Our state also imports a great number of commodities, freight and manufactured goods.

The Burlington-Northern and Santa Fe (BNSF) Railway Company's proposed second bridge paralleling the existing railroad bridge across Lake Pend Oreille will allow safe and simultaneous two-way rail traffic across the lake. The new bridge will reduce wait times, rail congestion and help improve air quality because of the two prior factors.

Construction of the second bridge will benefit the regional and Idaho economies by transporting timber, manufactured goods and agriculture commodities from Idaho. It will also improve schedule reliability for the Amtrak Empire Builder, which travels from Portland-Seattle to Chicago along this route.
