On the call of the Sponsor, a meeting of the Great Lakes Pilotage Advisory Committee was held on September 7, 2023, at the Lake Superior State University – Cisler Conference Center, in Sault Ste. - 4. Recommend for the post-2024 shipping season, Director, Great Lakes Pilotage, be given discretion to increase the staffing model plus three, based on industry demand and to ensure shipping reliability.

Motion unanimously passed.

5. Recommend that a pilot who becomes qualified on or before August 1st shall be included in the rate. Motion unanimously passed.

GREETING AND INTRODUCTION

The Designated Federal Officer, Mr. Kevin Kiefer, opened the meeting at 8:30 A.M. with welcoming remarks and offered introductions to the Committee and public attendees. Captain Gallagher, chairman, offered opening remarks, reviewed the administrative details, approved the previous GLPAC minutes, and offered a welcome. Topics begin on page 17 of the transcript.

Previous GLPAC meeting minutes: Unanimously passed the minutes from the 2022 GLPAC meeting.

Topic: Expense and Revenue Reports for Rulemaking:

Motion passed with 5 GLPAC members approving the recommendation and 1 member opposing.

3) A pilot who becomes qualified on or before August 1st shall be included in the rate.

Motion unanimously passed.
