It is reasonable to expect that most Port Facility premises would be considered "keep areas" or areas where the public would not be permitted unrestricted access. Such areas would then have some means of keeping unauthorized persons out of the keep area, such as a perimeter fence. Access by personnel and vehicles into and out of the keep area would be through a gate or gates. Some security measures will be imposed over human and/or vehicular traffic through these gates.

The series of drills in this book will seek to exact the basics of procedures and security personnel duties relating to the control of access on people, goods and vehicles through the security gates.
