Re: Chemical, Biological, Radiological Agent Notification

Please ensure that your agency notifies the National Response Center (NRC) of any suspected releases of chemical, radiological or biological agents that occur at your agency's facilities. There have been several incidents where envelopes filled with powdery material suspected as a biological agent were opened at federal offices and the NRC was not notified. The NRC plays a key role in activating the National Response System, and prompt notification is especially important from National Response Team member agencies. When such information is received, the NRC notifies the FBI and the pre-designated On Scene Coordinator for further action, if necessary.

Section 103 of CERCLA requires the notification of the NRC in the event of a "release or threat of release of a hazardous substance, pollutant or contaminant." At 40 CFR §300.125, the NCP states that "notice of an oil discharge or release of a hazardous substance in an amount equal to or greater than the reportable quantity must be made immediately. . . to the NRC Duty Officer." Notification can be made by calling either 800-424-8802, or for those without 800 access, 202-267-2675.
