

REVIEW OF CATEGORIZATION OF PANTRIES Procedure Number: SOLAS-42

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<u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of this Plan Review Guideline (PRG) is to provide clear guidance for determining whether a pantry warrants a category 9, 12, or 13 designation depending on the location in the vessel, communication to other spaces, and the equipment contained within the pantry.

1. Applicability

This PRG is applicable to SOLAS passenger ships carrying more than 36 passengers.

3. Reference Text

SOLAS II-2/9.2.2.3.2.2:

"(9) Sanitary and similar spaces

• Isolated pantries containing no cooking appliances in accommodation spaces."

"(12) Machinery spaces and main galleys

• Main galleys and annexes."

"(13) Store-rooms, workshops, pantries, etc.

• Main pantries not annexed to galleys."

4. Guidance

The following guidelines should be applied when determining the category of pantries:

- <u>Category 9</u>: Only those pantries which meet the design characteristics detailed in MSC.1/Circ. 1634 may be given a category 9 designation. These types of pantries should not contain any cooking appliances (except as allowed by MSC.1/Circ. 1436), built-in (walk-in) reefer units, or office-type furnishings. Portable refrigeration units are acceptable in category 9 spaces.
- <u>Category 12</u>: Pantries in which the only access is through a galley are considered annexed to that galley and should be given a category 12 designation. Pantries that are 30% or more open to a galley are considered part of the galley. In accordance with MSC.1/Circ. 1436, spaces containing any electrically heated cooking plate or hot plate for keeping food warm with a power of more than 5 kW should be regarded as galleys and should be given category 12 designations.
- <u>Category 13</u>: Pantries which do not meet either of the above characteristics for category 9 or 12 spaces may be given category 13 designations. The cooking appliance limitations detailed in MSC.1/Circ. 1436 apply.
